NOTE FROM THE PLAYWRIGHT/DIRECTOR

Curiosity may kill the cat, but it often sparks my engine.

Last winter, when signing up for an online presentation on Green Burials, I kinda-sorta figured out what the lecture would be about and immediately began thinking of writing a play with green burial as a central topic. It would be a Zoom play, I decided.

In my planning, the play's opening was easy: it was to be a family Zoom call involving an older woman and her two adult daughters. But as I began writing, Con showed up with the play's first line, and it was no longer a three-character piece. And not many pages further, Robert appeared. And then Xan joined the call. Twice as many characters, multiplied interaction.

Meanwhile, the online Green Burials session I attended in March was wonderfully informative and surprisingly personal. The Washington, DC attorney who conducted the lecture shared the story (and photos) of his father's green burial. It—and additional research—inspired in me a deeper interest and understanding of how consideration for our environment, and indeed for our planet, can, in ways both small and large, affect our better decisions.

The resultant "Greening Zabella"— is an exploration of family and friendship and the opening of minds.
